The first page of each manuscript must show only the author's name, address, phone number and the title of the paper. The author's name should not appear on any subsequent page. The email subject line should state type of submission (scientific paper) and for which meeting. Scientific Papers are for oral presentation and must be no longer than 22 pages, double-spaced. Please include an abstract of 250 words or less.

All manuscripts are distributed anonymously to three referees. Evaluations are integrated by a subcommittee chair who makes a recommendation for acceptance or rejection.
