Title: *A Comprehensive and Comparative Compilation of Psychoanalytic Journals* (a.k.a. *The Journal Profiling Project*).

Author: Scholarship Section, Department of Psychoanalytic Education, the American Psychoanalytic Association (APsaA).

Mission: To provide psychoanalytic writers with a vehicle to compare currently published psychoanalytic journals. Contained herein is a complete list of each of the 40 journals covered along with essential information about:

- *What each journal is looking for* in the way of submissions (their theoretic orientation) and the varying formats accepted (e.g., main articles, book reviews, film reviews, poetry, research papers).
- *Comparative journal metrics* in the form of journal rankings, how often journal articles are cited, how long it takes for journals to respond to submissions.
- *Submission requirements and methods*.

Audience:

- Authors wishing to determine which journal might be best suited for the papers they have written or are considering writing.
- Publishers of psychoanalytic journals wishing to review the features of other, competing journals.

JOURNAL PUBLISHING METRICS

(Source: Resurchify website data for 2022)

- **IMPACT SCORE:** A MEASURE OF THE AVERAGE NUMBER OF CITATIONS RECEIVED IN THE PRESENT YEAR PER ARTICLE PUBLISHED IN A GIVEN JOURNAL DURING THE PRECEDING TWO YEARS (based on Scopus data): While the impact factor (provided by the Journal Citation Report (JCR)) is more commonly used by journals themselves, we found it easier to obtain information about the impact score (via the Resurchify website). This metric should suffice for the purpose of this site; our aim is to provide a way for writers to compare the relative vs. absolute degree to which articles appearing in a given journal are cited. For those wishing to determine the impact factor, please refer to the Web of Science data source (<https://clarivate.com/>).

In the field of psychoanalysis, the Impact Score ranges from 1.49 for *Psychoanalytic Psychology* to 0.06 for the *International Forum of Psychoanalysis*.

- **SJR RATING:** MEASURE OF A JOURNAL'S SCIENTIFIC INFLUENCE: SCImago Journal Rank (SJR, <https://www.scimagojr.com/>) considers the number of citations received by a journal and the importance of the journals from which these citations come.

In the field of psychoanalysis, SJR Rating ranges from 1.049 for the *International Journal of Psychoanalysis* to 0.108 for the *Scandinavian Psychoanalytic Review*.

- **OVERALL RANKING:** (#1 = the most highly sighted journals, such as *Lancet* and the *NEJM*).

In the field of psychoanalysis, rankings range from 3,552 (highest) for the *International Journal of Psychoanalysis* to 24,650 (lowest) for the *Scandinavian Psychoanalytic Review*.

ADDITIONAL JOURNAL METRICS

Taylor & Francis provides additional metrics on their website for the 17 psychoanalytic journals they publish. These metrics include:

- speed of acceptance
- the acceptance rate as a percentage of papers submitted
- annual downloads
- impact factors, Scopus Citescore
- SJR (presently listed for 2021)

With regard to speed of acceptance/publication, Taylor & Francis collects the following data:

- From submission to first decision: the average (median) number of days for a manuscript submitted to the journal to receive a first decision.
- From submission to first post-review decision: the average (median) number of days for a manuscript submitted to the journal to receive a first decision if it is sent out for peer review.
- From acceptance to online publication: the average (median) number of days from acceptance of a manuscript to online publication of the Version of Record.

The metrics provided by Taylor & Francis are very helpful, and it would be a boon to writers were all journals to provide information about how long it takes for a submission to garner a response, internet usage measured as the number of times a journal was digitally accessed, and the overall acceptance rate.

RANGES OF METRICS

Speed of journal response to submission ranges from:

- 2-3 days (*Psychoanalytic Social Work; Psychoanalysis, Self, and Context*) to greater than 100 days (*Contemporary Psychoanalysis*, 166 days; *International Forum of Psychoanalysis*, 173 days; and *Scandinavian Psychoanalytic Review*, 239 days).
- Those journals whose response times are less than 100 days include: *Neuropsychanalysis* (24 days); *Journal of Child Psychotherapy* (32 days); *Journal of Infant, Child, and Adolescent Psychotherapy* (39 days); *International Journal of Psychoanalysis* (62 days); *Psychoanalytic Inquiry* (69 days); *Psychoanalytic Perspectives* (75 days); *Studies in Gender and Sexuality* (75 days); *Psychoanalytic Dialogues* (89 days).
- Excluding outliers, the average response time is 55 days.

Acceptance rate:

These range from around 80% for *Journal of Child Psychotherapy*, *Journal of Infant, Child, and Adolescent Psychotherapy* and *Neuropsychanalysis* to 33% for the *International Journal of Psychoanalysis* and around 25% for both *Psychoanalytic Dialogues* and *Psychoanalytic Perspectives*.

Yearly downloads:

These range from 128K for the *International Journal of Psychoanalysis* and 89K for *Psychoanalytic Inquiry* to 12K for *Psychoanalytic Perspectives* and 10K for *Scandinavian Psychoanalytic Review*.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSIONS

The following guidelines apply to many if not most psychoanalytic journals.

- In assessing a submission, one key quality used by reviewers in assessing the publication worthiness of a paper is whether it constitutes a “novel contribution” to the literature. For one’s submission to be a novel contribution requires that the author conduct a thorough literature review of the relevant literature to be able to contextualize the author’s main thesis relative to what has previously been written about the subject. The Psychoanalytic Electronic Press (PEP) website is ideally suited for this purpose.
- Every submitter must abide by the general policy that a submission must be sent *exclusively* to one journal at a time; submitting to two journals simultaneously is forbidden. Authors are required to attest to the fact their submission is exclusive.
- Every attempt should be made to carefully disguise the identity of any individuals whose clinical material appears in a submission. Consideration should be given to asking the patient’s express permission to use material from sessions. Doing so does not presently appear to be a hard requirement of journals, but adequate disguise is an absolute requirement. Access to published work has never been easier for the lay populace to access, which heightens the need to protect the patient’s anonymity. For guidelines, see:

- Manuscripts must *not* contain the author’s name on any page (exclusive of the title page) or within the body of the manuscript (i.e., in referencing the author’s previous work). If the author quotes himself, many journals now require the author’s name be substituted with: “Author’s Name,” followed by the date of the paper or talk being cited.
- Peer review means the journal makes attempts to blind the author’s identity so the paper can receive an unbiased assessment.
- Most if not all journals require the paper format and references conform to APA (American Psychological Association) style. Manuscripts must be double-spaced on 8.5 x 11 in. with 1 in. margins. Each page of the text must be numbered. Generally, documents must be formatted as a WORD document: Times New Roman, 12 pt. font. Refer to the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association* for guidance in formatting references and page citations (<http://www.palgrave-journals.com/ajp/about.htm>). References from electronic sources must include full URL code and the date retrieved. The list of references should include only works cited in the essay.

- Footnotes should be used sparingly and not for giving references. Footnotes should be numbered consecutively using Arabic numbers and should be on the bottom of the relevant page.
- Beside the “main document,” submissions also require an abstract that usually is 150-200 words long. The abstract should succinctly describe the author’s main points and the way these points will be conveyed.
- In the process of electronically submitting, many journals ask the author to provide key words that will help better identify the paper’s contents.
- Title pages should include full names of authors; degrees; academic and professional affiliations; complete mailing address; telephone number; fax number; and the e-mail address of the author to whom proofs are to be sent.
- The review process involves 2-3 reviewers who carefully read the paper and provide comments about whether the paper is publication worthy and whether it is the type of paper the editorial board considers to be consistent with their view of their journal’s mission. Reviews arrive, more or less, at three basic conclusions: 1) *reject*; 2) *needs considerable revision*, where the journal is willing to take a second look at the paper once the author has considered and responded to the points and objections raised by reviewers, but the author should realize there is no guarantee the revised paper will rise to the level that it is accepted for publication; 3) a *conditional acceptance* with recommendations for possible revisions that would further strengthen the submission. If the paper is rejected outright, there is no recourse with that given journal. The author might consider moving on to another journal. Some – maybe all – prolific writers have had the experience of having their paper rejected by one journal only to have it accepted by another. One world-renowned and highly esteemed author told me his papers were consistently rejected by one journal though they were routinely accepted by the *IJPA*.
- Be respectful of the amount of work reviewers dedicate to reviewing papers. Many seriously study the paper and provide invaluable feedback that, if considered, will considerably strengthen your paper. Rejections and “needs serious revision” are hard to hear and are unfortunate but unavoidable aspects of the publishing experience.
- Speed of acceptance and the amount of time the elapses between submission and publication vary widely from journal to journal. Taylor & Francis lists on their website such data for the 17 psychoanalytic journals they publish. Ideally, all journals should provide such information to submitters as a service to them.

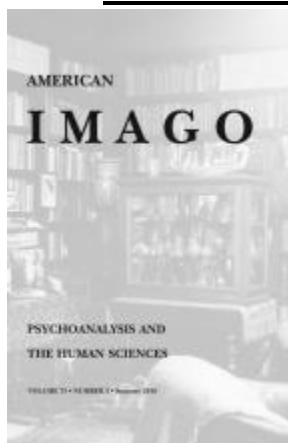

SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS:

SUBMISSION WORD/PAGE LIMITATIONS: Articles submitted to the journal should be approximately 7000-9000 words. Where appropriate, the journal will consider lengthier submissions. Article submissions must include an abstract. Review essays should be 4000-6000 words, and book reviews should be 2000-3000 words. Like article manuscripts, review essays and book reviews must be submitted in full to be considered for publication.

SUBMIT TO: All submissions to *American Imago* must be sent via email to the Editor at jane.hanenberg@verizon.net.

WHAT THE JOURNAL IS LOOKING FOR:

American Imago encourages submission of original scholarly papers relating psychoanalytic concepts to any area of the human sciences (e.g., history, literature, the arts, film, music, psychosocial experience, politics, etc.). Reviewers evaluate the quality of scholarship, clarity of

expression, and originality of submissions and recommend acceptance, rejection, or revision. Review reports are sent to authors. If revisions are recommended, authors may resubmit papers for a second review process leading to final acceptance or rejection. *American Imago* publishes reviews and review essays of books and special events related to its mission. Reviews may be submitted or solicited by the Editor, and they are reviewed for quality and expression by the Editor before acceptance or rejection. Occasionally, the Editor may solicit papers and arrange for special issues on topics of contemporary interest.

SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS:

SUBMISSION WORD/PAGE LIMITATIONS: (Conflicting Data)

- Original papers up to 10,000 words, including references, contributed solely to *The American Journal of Psychoanalysis*, will be considered for publication.
- Original papers (of no more than 25 pages, about 7500 words, including references) will be considered for publication and should be submitted to the Editor (see above).
