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* 5. Notes for Panel Proposals & Scientific Papers

Panel Proposals:

If your panel proposal is accepted, the following will apply:

1) The APsA Program Committee works actively with panel proposal organizers to shape panel proposals. This includes both the format and participants. Panel proposers are encouraged to describe a general topic of inquiry, questions, and possible participants or categories of participants.

2) The Program Committee is committed to increasing and widening participation in programs. Among suggested participants, panel proposals should always include at least one participant who has not been on a program before or who has not been on a program in the past five years. On all programs, we will aim for a mix of already-known presenters and those who are earlier in their career, less-well-known, or have not participated recently. Representation of the range of member institutes and of member diversity will be fostered.

Scientific Paper Proposals:

1) If a paper is accepted for the meeting, the Journal of the American Psychoanalytic Association (JAPA) has right of first consideration. The paper cannot have been accepted or be under consideration for publication by another journal. JAPA submissions must be done separately. For further information regarding JAPA submissions, please contact Jennifer Mahar, JAPA Managing Editor (jennifer@origineditorial.com).

2) Papers should be timed for 40-minutes reading time.
